

## CrescentCare Adult Outpatient Psychiatry: What to Expect

- ✓ Your first appointment is a psychiatric evaluation and will last approximately one hour.
- ✓ For individuals seeking evaluation and/or treatment for ADHD: Any issues with mood/depression, anxiety, substance use, etc. will be treated first. Once reasonably controlled, assessing for and treating ADHD is appropriate. Non-stimulant medication and addressing executive functioning skills deficits are the preferred treatments for ADHD.
- ✓ For individuals seeking treatment with benzodiazepines or "Z-drug" sleep aids (e.g., Xanax, Klonopin, Ambien, etc.): For safety, our general practice approach is **not** to prescribe these medications long-term or continuously.
- Controlled substance prescribing: The outpatient psychiatry treatment team requires consent to a "Controlled Medication Agreement" to receive any controlled medication. You will be asked to provide a urine sample for baseline testing and random urine samples for testing throughout treatment. You must have at least two (2) in-person appointments per 12-month period to receive controlled medications.
- ✓ Controlled medications are highly regulated by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency. This procedure is in place to ensure our medical management is safe and evidence based, as well as to avoid distribution or use of the medication that is not intended by your provider.
- Once stabilized, you may be referred to your primary care provider for maintenance treatment.
